<b>California Propositions Fall 2024</b>			
<b>2</b>	Recommend No <b>Bond for Schools</b>	This bond measure is for remodeling schools which sounds good but it is more long-term debt with a final cost nearly double the original bond amount. School building maintenance should be part of the state's annual budget.	
<b>3</b>	Recommend No <b>Marriage Amendment</b>	California law allows same-sex marriage However, the California Constitution still states that marriage is between a man and woman. If approved by the voters, this Constitutional Amendment would take away that language.	
<b>4</b>	Recommend No <b>Bond with Green Agenda</b>	Another bond. We need to pay as we go not borrow into the future leaving our children and grandchildren to pay the bill.	
<b>5</b>	Recommend No <b>Low Income Housing</b>	Another tax. Government's attempts to manipulate the housing market have always ended up with unintended consequences. Enabling private real estate investment is the answer.	
<b>6</b>	Recommend No <b>Slavery</b>	This Prop would allow prisoners in jail the right to refuse to do a work assignment. Those sentenced to prison are there as a punishment for crimes they committed against society. Part of that sentence is being assigned to work details.	
<b>32</b>	Recommend No <b>Minimum Wage</b>	Forcing private enterprise to raise the minimum wage always has unintended consequences. This is more government meddling in private business.	
<b>33</b>	Recommend No <b>Rent Control</b>	Even though rent control holds down prices in the short-term, it also reduces supply as owners withdraw from the market. Reduced supply eventually leads to much higher prices than before rent control was implemented.	
<b>34</b>	Recommend Yes <b>Spending for Health Care</b>	The general consensus is that this is a good Prop. It requires that 98% of revenue received from federal discount prescription drug programs go directly to patient care.

<b>36</b>	Recommend Yes <b>Restores Stiffer Penalties for Retail Theft</b>	Retail theft has greatly increased since Prop 47 was passed. Prop 36 reverses Prop 47 and restores stiff penalties for stealing. Prop 36 is strongly supported by Riverside District Attorney Mike Hestrin plus many others.
